

CORS Queueing Special Interest Group – Bylaws (September 16, 2022)

1. The Queueing and Applied Probability Special Interest Group (herein referred to as “The SIG”) operates as part of the Canadian Operational Research Society (herein referred to as “CORS”).
2. The purpose of The SIG is to provide a specialized forum within CORS for the field of queueing and applied probability.
3. Any member of CORS may become a member of The SIG. All members shall have equal rights, duties and privileges within The SIG.
4. The President of The SIG is responsible for the affairs of The SIG. The President shall preside at meetings and represent The SIG in external affairs. The President shall also establish and appoint such committees as may be required. In addition, the President shall be responsible for maintaining communication with the CORS Executive.
5. The President is responsible for providing an annual report on the SIG’s activities during the preceding year. This may be done either directly or by a delegate. The report should be suitable for publication in the CORS Bulletin.
6. The President is responsible for the organization of a Queueing cluster at each annual CORS Meeting. This may be done either directly or by a delegate.
7. The President is responsible for maintaining The SIG website. This may be done either directly or by a delegate.
8. The term of office for the President is two years. The President will be elected at the annual CORS Meeting. The President cannot be re-elected.
9. Amendments to the Bylaws will be communicated to membership prior to the annual Business Meeting at the CORS annual conference. There will be opportunity for discussion at the Business Meeting. An electronic vote will then be taken within 8 weeks of the Business Meeting.
